THE CHARLES S. COCK HOUSE MUSEUM aka THE COTTAGE KITCHEN, 400 E. Hopkins Street

The Charles S. Cock House Museum, erected in 1867, is a modest, Vernacular Greek Revival structure and is the oldest remaining residential building in San Marcos. Although it is owned by the city of San Marcos, the Heritage Association has been a steward of the house for almost 50 years. Through the leadership of the Heritage Guild, HASM began offering Cottage Kitchen luncheons in April 1976. We are in the process of restoring this iconic building and hope to reopen our Cottage Kitchen lunches in 2024. SANTA CLAUS

This magical, sleigh-riding giver of gifts journeys across the globe one night a year so this interview was very special. During the build up to Christmas, kids have many questions about Santa and I hope you share this with them. We compiled a list of questions for Santa to answer and I managed to get an email for his workshop in the North Pole. We are thrilled that he replied during his busiest time of the year.

Q1: What is your real name? Santa Claus, Kris Kringle, Father Christmas, Saint Nick? A: That depends on who asks and what country they're from, but in the end, it's always me.

Q2: How old are you? A: Really, really old. So old I stopped counting after 300 years, and Mrs. Claus says it doesn't matter.

Q3: How many elves do you have working for you?

A: I don't keep track anymore! The elves love to make toys & they each specialize in a type of toy production. For example, if an elf trains in bike making then that elf makes bikes. Some elves test toys to make sure they work properly. There are lots of different jobs for elves and it's a great place to work with free hot chocolate!

magic. I stand at the top of the chimney & sprinkle some Christmas magic dust then poof! I'm in, safe & sound!

Q8: How do you find everyone's house, Santa?

A: The reindeers have an amazing sense of direction. Rudolph leads the team with his red nose so we can see where we're going. We visit each town, one at a time, look for every house celebrating Christmas & stop.

Q9: Santa, how do you fit the big toys down the chimney?

A: This is another time when Christmas magic comes into play! The toys are magically shrunk into small spaces. When I get into the house & take out the toys, they expand to their proper size.

Q10: How do you eat all of the cookies & milk?

A: Delivering toys is a lot work & I get really hungry but sometimes I just have a bite and a little sip of the drink.

Q11: Santa, how do you train the reindeer?

A: The reindeer train all year long like professional athletes. They do stretches, exercise, fly several miles a day and eat healthy foods so they stay strong & fit.
